BYLAW NO. 602

A bylaw to provide for the regulation of solid waste disposal and tipping fees at qathet regional District Solid Waste Management Facilities.

WHEREAS pursuant to supplementary letters patent issued on November 23, 1970, as amended, the qathet Regional District is authorized to provide for the disposal of garbage and waste and to establish and impose charges for this purpose;

AND WHEREAS the qathet Regional District has, pursuant to "Waste Management Conversion and Service Establishment Bylaw No. 523, 2017" established the function of solid waste management as a service;

AND WHEREAS the qathet Regional District is empowered to establish a scale of charges payable for depositing solid waste at Solid Waste Management Facilities;

AND WHEREAS the qathet Regional District has an approved Solid Waste Management Plan under section 24 of the Environmental Management Act which authorizes the qathet Regional District to manage municipal solid waste and recyclable materials in accordance with the plan;

AND WHEREAS the qathet Regional District operates Solid Waste Management Facilities for disposal of solid waste, and maintains a system to collect, remove, and dispose of Residual Solid Waste;

NOW THEREFORE, The Board of the qathet Regional District in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. TITLE

This bylaw may be cited as "qathet Regional District Solid Waste Regulation and Tipping Fee Bylaw No. 602, 2025".

2. SCHEDULES

For the purpose of this bylaw, Schedule 'A' through Schedule 'D' are attached to and form part of this bylaw.

3. DEFINITIONS

In this bylaw, unless the context otherwise requires, all definitions are listed in Schedule 'A' to the bylaw.

4. CONDITIONS OF USE

- a) No person shall deposit any material at qRD **Solid Waste Management Facilities**, except in accordance with this bylaw.
- b) No person shall deposit **Controlled Waste** as defined in Schedule 'B' at **Solid Waste Management Facilities** without approval from the **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s).
- c) No person shall deposit **Prohibited Waste** as defined in Schedule 'B' at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**.
- d) No person shall deposit the **Recyclable Materials** listed in Schedule 'D' at **Solid Waste Management Facilities** unless they are accepted at that facility and are separated and deposited at the designated collection points.
- e) All materials delivered to **Solid Waste Management Facilities** must be free from **Contamination** with **Controlled Waste, Prohibited Waste, and Recyclable Materials**. The presence of **Contamination** delivered in any load shall be determined through visual observation by the **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s).
- f) Any load containing **Dusty Material** must be securely bagged prior to **Disposal**.
- g) Any load entering **Solid Waste Management Facilities** must be properly secured, either with a tarpaulin, cover, or tie-down apparatus to prevent any of the load escaping, or falling off of the haul vehicle.
- h) No person shall **scavenge**, salvage, or remove material deposited at **Solid Waste Management Facilities** unless the activity occurs within designated areas, at designated times, and is authorized by the **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s).
- i) Children under 13 years of age are not permitted in high-risk areas of **Solid Waste Management Facilities** unless they remain under the control of a parent or guardian at all times.
- j) Where posted, pets must remain inside vehicles at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**. Certified guide dogs and service animals are permitted, provided they are under the control of their handler at all times.
- k) Every person shall operate a vehicle in accordance with all traffic control devices posted at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**. All vehicles arriving at a **Solid Waste Management Facility** for **Disposal** shall be weighed upon entering and exiting the facility. Every person shall exit the **Solid Waste Management Facility** without delay after unloading.

- l) No **person** shall leave their vehicle unattended at **Solid Waste Management Facilities** overnight unless approved by the **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s).
- m) **Offensive Behaviour** is not permitted at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**. The **Manager or Supervisor** may remove and prevent further access to a **Solid Waste Management Facility** any person who engages in **Offensive Behaviour**.

5. FEES AND VIOLATIONS

- a) Any person depositing material at qRD **Solid Waste Management Facilities** shall pay to the **Regional District** the applicable fees set out in Schedule 'C'. Fees vary by facility and material as shown in the fee schedule. Where the facility contains a weigh scale, the fee based on weight shall apply.
- b) Where the fee is based on weight, it shall be based on the difference between the loaded weight and the unloaded weight of the vehicle carrying the load, as determined by the weigh scales at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**.
- c) Where the fee is based on weight, each material type deposited on site will be weighed independently to determine the appropriate fees. In the case of unsorted materials, or refusal to weigh materials independently, the entire load will be charged at the highest rate applicable to the materials delivered as determined through visual observation by the **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s).
- d) Where a fee is based on weight and the fee calculated based on weight in accordance with sections (b), (c) and (d), above, falls below the applicable minimum fee set out in Schedule C, the minimum fee shall apply.
- e) In the event that weigh scales are unavailable for fees based on weight:
 - i) Residential users will pay the minimum fee for each material type delivered to the **Solid Waste Management Facility**. Multiple minimum fees may apply.
 - ii) **Commercial** users will pay a fee based on the average weight of the hauler's previous loads for the respective material type, or the minimum fees for the material type, whichever is higher.
 - iii) In all cases, Scale House staff will communicate with users when vehicle weigh scales are unavailable prior to unloading materials. Users may choose to retain their materials and return to site when vehicle weigh scales are available.
- f) Where the fee is based on a per unit rate, the units will be counted independently of other materials.
- g) All fees payable under this Bylaw shall be paid to the **Regional District** by cash, cheque, debit, or credit card prior to leaving **Solid Waste Management Facilities**.

- h) Notwithstanding Section 2(g), any user disposing of material at **Solid Waste Management Facilities** on a regular basis may apply in writing to the **Regional District** for a credit account. If credit is granted by the Regional District's Finance Officer, payment of the account in full shall be due within thirty (30) days of the invoice date. The Regional District reserves the right to cancel, upon five (5) days' notice, the credit offered herein for late payment, non-payment, or other justified cause.
- i) Any waste received in contravention of this bylaw shall be subject to a minimum fee of \$265.00 for the first hour of **Contamination** cleanup, with additional time charged at a rate of \$265.00 per hour thereafter.
- j) Any person who contravenes this bylaw, by doing any act which the bylaw forbids, or omitting to do any act which the bylaw requires, is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and not more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00). A separate offence shall be deemed to be committed upon each day during and in which the contravention occurs or continues.
- k) No person shall commit, cause, or permit any act that contravenes this bylaw.

6. **OPERATING HOURS**

- a. Regular hours of operation will be posted at all **Solid Waste Management Facilities** and the **Regional District's** website.
- b. The **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s) may turn away incoming vehicles if permitting the vehicles entry to the **Solid Waste Management Facility** would cause the facility to remain open beyond posted operating hours.
- c. **Solid Waste Management Facilities** will be closed on statutory holidays in British Columbia and all other days deemed a holiday by the **Regional District**, unless otherwise stated.
- d. The **Manager** may temporarily modify **Solid Waste Management Facility** hours, with notice, for required personnel training and facility maintenance events.
- e. The **Manager, Supervisor**, or their designate(s) may temporarily modify **Solid Waste Management Facility** hours, with no notice, in exceptional circumstances for safety or emergency purposes.

7. **REPEAL**

"qathet Regional District Solid Waste Regulation and Tipping Fee Bylaw No. 532, 2018."and any amendments thereto are hereby repealed.

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Schedule A – Definitions

“Agricultural Waste”

Means solid waste that is discarded from agricultural operations, including, but not limited to: ***Dead Animals***, slaughter waste, waste from crops, spoiled crops, manure and large quantities of film plastics, twine, and plastic containers used in agricultural operations.

“Asbestos Containing Material”

Means waste that falls under one or more of the following categories:

- a. Waste containing friable asbestos fibers or asbestos dust as defined in the ***Hazardous Waste Regulation*** as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder.
- b. ***Gypsum*** that meets one of the following conditions:
 - i. manufactured prior to December 31, 1990 and has no analytical results that confirm it is non-Asbestos containing
 - ii. manufactured on or after January 1, 1991 without one of the following identifiers to qualify as recyclable ***Gypsum***: barcode, date stamp, or web address.

“Biomedical Waste”

Means waste as defined in the ***Hazardous Waste Regulation*** as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder

“Board”

Means the qathet Regional District Board of Directors. This board consists of elected representatives from each of the municipal and electoral area member participants within the qathet Regional District.

“Bulky Item”

Means individual ***Municipal Solid Waste*** items for ***Disposal*** that do not fit within standard sized garbage bags and does not include ***Mattresses*** or other items with specified measurements or units defined in this bylaw.

“Clean Wood Waste”

Includes wood off-cuts, dimensional lumber, plywood, particle board, fibreboard, oriented strand board, pallets, crating, wood fencing, wood shingles, or wooden doors. These materials may contain water-based paint and stain, wood glue, small nails, staples, and screws.

Does not include pressure treated wood, wood with oil-based paint or stain, laminated wood products, medium-density fibreboard, bamboo and wicker (see ***Contaminated Wood Waste***).

Must be separated from other ***Construction/Demolition Waste***.

“Commercial Waste”	<p>Means Municipal Solid Waste from Commercial sources that is free from Contamination with any Recyclable Material, Hazardous Material, Controlled Waste or Prohibited Waste.</p>
“Commingled Food and Yard Waste”	<p>Means commingled Food Waste and Yard Waste. Also referred to as “organics”.</p>
“Construction, Renovation, and Demolition Waste” (C&D)	<p>Means refuse produced as a result of the construction, renovation, and demolition of buildings, structures, or portions of a structure, but does not include any:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Recyclable Material• Asbestos Containing Materials• Gypsum• Controlled or Prohibited Waste• Hazardous Waste
“Contaminated Sites Regulation”	<p>Means the Contaminated Sites Regulation, B.C. Regulation 375/96, enacted under the Environmental Management Act, as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder</p>
“Contaminated Soil”	<p>Means soil with concentrations of contaminants greater than those listed in the Contaminated Sites Regulation or soils containing waste material.</p>
“Contaminated Wood Waste”	<p>Includes products listed as Clean Wood Waste that are pressure treated, or contain oil-based paint or stain. Plus, laminated wood products, medium-density fibreboard, bamboo and wicker.</p> <p>May include water-based paint and stain, wood glue, small nails, staples, and screws. Must be separated from other Construction, Renovation, and Demolition Waste.</p>

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Schedule A – Definitions

"Controlled Waste"	Means those items listed in Schedule 'B' which may create health hazards, nuisances, or environmental pollution and require advanced notice prior to Disposal and Special Handling .
"Contaminated and Contamination"	Means the presence of Recyclable Material, Controlled Waste, Prohibited Waste or the presence of other mixed materials in a load that cannot be separated prior to Disposal .
"Creosote Treated Wood"	Means wood that has been preserved by a pressure treatment with an anti-microbial pesticide product containing creosote, which may include, but is not limited to: railway ties, telephone poles, and dock pilings.
"Dead Animal"	Means the carcass or part of the carcass of an animal including, bones, feathers, skins, hair, and organs.
"Disposal"	Means leaving solid waste at Solid Waste Management Facilities , for the purpose of landfilling, composting, or recycling.
"Drums"	Means plastic or Metal barrels larger than 50 litres capacity.
"Dusty Material"	Means material that can become airborne while in transit, or when being deposited or managed at a Solid Waste Management Facility , including, but not limited to: sawdust, insulation, ash, and soot.
"Environmental Management Act"	Means the <i>Environmental Management Act</i> (British Columbia), as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder.
"Explosives"	Means fireworks, ammunition, gunpowder or cartridges, dynamite, blasting caps and other demolition materials, aerosol cans, or pressurized containers that could explode under pressure.
"Food Waste"	Means compostable organic material including raw and cooked food waste from a Commercial or residential premises and includes but is not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) fruits and vegetables,b) meat, fish, shellfish, poultry and bones thereof,c) dairy products, egg shells,d) bread, pasta and baked goods,e) tea bags, coffee grounds and filters,f) food-soiled paper plates and cups,g) food-soiled paper towels and napkins,h) food soiled cardboard and paper

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Schedule A – Definitions

“Gypsum”	Includes, but is not limited to, new construction off-cuts or scraps and old wallboard that has been painted, covered in wallpaper, vinyl, ceramic tile, or lath and plaster, and is removed during renovation or demolition. Excludes any Asbestos Containing Material .
“Hazardous Waste”	Means any material defined as such in the Hazardous Waste Regulation (B.C Reg. 63/2009), which includes, but is not limited to: toxins, poisons, corrosives, irritants, strong sensitizers, flammables, and Ignitable Materials .
“Hazardous Waste Regulation”	Means Hazardous Waste Regulation, BC Reg. 63/88 enacted under the Environmental Management Act , as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder.
“Ignitable Materials”	Means having the properties of: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) Flammable gasb) Flammable liquid, orc) Flammable solids, substance liable to spontaneous combustion, or substances that on contact with water emit flammable gases.
“Invasive Plant Species”	Means any invasive alien plant species that has the potential to pose undesirable or detrimental impacts on humans, animals, or ecosystems, including those plants identified on the Province of B.C.’s <i>Priority Invasive Species List</i> . Means Yard Waste that may or may not be accepted for composting and which may require Special Handling .
“Land Clearing Waste”	Means stumps, tops, limbs and whole trees generated from the clearing of land and the harvesting of merchantable timber but does not include Yard Waste .
“Landfill”	Means the landfill designated to receive qathet Regional District's Residual Solid Waste .
“Liquid or Sludges”	See: Pumpings, Sewage and sewage by-products, including septic tank waste, Waste oil, or Petroleum by-products .
“Manager”	Means the person appointed to the position of Manager of Environmental Services, or equivalent position, within the Regional District .
“Marketable”	Means materials that can be managed through existing recycling programs and for which commercial markets exist.

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Schedule A – Definitions

"Mattress"	Means a large, rectangular pad used as a bed or on a bed frame and include all sizes of mattresses, box-springs, and foam sleeping pads.
"Metal"	Means recyclable ferrous and non-ferrous metallic materials but does not include ozone depleting substances (ODS) containing units unless properly certified as having refrigerants professionally removed, or motor vehicle bodies and farm implements.
"Municipal Solid Waste" (MSW)	Means refuse that originates from residential, commercial, institutional, demolition, land clearing or construction sources, or refuse specified to be included in the Regional District's Solid Waste Management Plan pursuant to the Environmental Management Act .
"Person"	Means an individual, a body corporate, a firm partnership, association, or any other legal entity or an employee or agent thereof.
"Prohibited Waste"	Means a waste prohibited from Disposal under Schedule 'B'.
"Pumpings"	Means dewatered liquid and semi-solid materials collected by a vactor truck or pump and transported by vactor truck, tanker truck, or other container.
"Radioactive Materials"	Means "radioactive waste" as defined in the Hazardous Waste Regulation as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder
"Reactive Waste"	Means waste that is "reactive" as defined in the Hazardous Waste Regulation as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder
"Recyclable Material"	Means materials that can be managed through existing recycling and reuse programs at Solid Waste Management Facilities and private recycling facilities in the Regional District .
"Recycling Regulation"	Means the Recycling Waste Regulation BC 449/2004 enacted under the Environmental Management Act , as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder.
"Regional District"	Means the qathet Regional District.
"Residual Solid Waste"	Means that portion of Municipal Solid Waste for which no management option exists except landfilling at the Landfill , but does not include Controlled or Prohibited Waste under Schedule 'B'.

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Schedule A – Definitions

“Salvage” and “Scavenging”	Means the removal and recovery of materials for reuse or sale.
“Sewage and sewage by-products, including septic tank waste”	Means sewage as defined in the Hazardous Waste Regulation as amended, and any successor legislation and any regulations thereunder
“Solid Waste Management Facility and Facilities”	Means the Regional District’s Resource Recovery Centre, the Texada Island Metal Transfer Station, areas used for the Lasqueti Island waste transfer program, Recycling Depots, and other facilities the Regional District may establish from time to time.
“Special Handling”	Means material handling by Solid Waste Management Facilities staff that includes but is not limited to: unloading assistance, review of test results, grinding, chipping, or materials that require containment, specialized protective equipment, or pose an increased hazard exposure risk.
“Supervisor”	Means the person appointed to the position of Waste Diversion Supervisor of the Regional District , or their designate.
“Tight Head Barrels (non-removable tops)”	Means closed-head or non-removable head drums that are characterized by a permanently sealed top with no removable lid.
“Tires”	Means all rubber tires, including bicycle tires.
“Unsecured Load”	Means any material that is not secured with a tarpaulin, cover, or tie-down apparatus that prevents material from escaping or falling off of the haul vehicle during transit to, and Disposal at, Solid Waste Management Facilities .
“Waste Oil or Petroleum By- Products”	Means any petroleum-based or synthetic oil that has become unsuitable for its original purpose due to Contamination or loss of properties, such as used motor oil, hydraulic fluids, or Contaminated fuel.
“Yard Waste”	Means vegetation removed from trees, shrubs, and gardens, and includes already chipped Clean Wood Waste . Must be free from Contamination , Food Waste , rocks, Soil , and cannot exceed a diameter of 5cm.

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Schedule B – Controlled and Prohibited Waste

The following materials are not accepted at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**, except with permission of the Supervisor, Manager, or their designate(s). Drop off should be coordinated with facility staff in advance and, if accepted, must be separated and deposited at the designated collection points at the **Waste Management Facility**,

1. Controlled Waste, including but not limited to:

- a) **Agricultural Waste**
- b) **Dead Animals**
- c) **Waste Oil or Petroleum By-products**
- d) **Invasive Plant Species**
- e) Large quantities of any accepted materials, as determined by the **Supervisor, Manager**, or their designate(s).

The following gaseous, liquid, and solid wastes are prohibited from **Disposal** and will not be accepted at **Solid Waste Management Facilities**, including but not limited to:

2. Prohibited Waste, including but not limited to:

- a) **Asbestos Containing Materials**
- b) **Biomedical Waste**, including:
 - i. Hospital "sharps"
 - ii. Body tissue or fluids
 - iii. Pathological or infectious wastes
- c) **Contaminated Soil**
- d) **Creosote Treated Wood**
- e) **Explosives**
- f) Gas cylinders, except as permitted in this bylaw
- g) **Gypsum - Divertible and Non-Divertible**
- h) **Hazardous Waste or Reactive Chemicals** – solid, liquid or gas, excluding **Stewardship Materials**
- i) **Ignitable Materials**
- j) **Land Clearing Waste**
- k) **Liquids or Sludges**
- l) Loads containing materials that are smoldering or on fire
- m) **Petroleum By-products**
- n) **Radioactive Materials**
- o) **Reactive Waste**
- p) **Sewage and sewage by-products**, including septic tank waste
- q) **Tight Head Barrels (non-removable tops)**
