From the Area C Director....

I need to start this month's report by sending out my congratulations and appreciation to Malaspina Volunteer Fire Department Chief Dave Keiver for his forty years of service. This amazing milestone was celebrated on March 16th with a ceremony at the fire hall that was capped off by a speech and medal presentation by the BC Fire Commissioner. Dave's dedication and willingness to give back to his community is inspiring – if everyone gave of themselves at even a fraction of the level that Dave has, we'd all be better off.

This month the Stillwater Community Advisory Group hosted Murray Hall, an expert in tree fiber and its commercial uses. His talk was focused primarily on the devastating effects that the mountain pine beetle had on the paper and lumber sectors and that those effects will be felt for decades to come. Murray, a forty year veteran, had written the Powell River mill off for the last five years, not seeing any way that it would survive while other paper mills and sawmills around the province were closing. The recent purchase of this mill by Paper Excellence was like a knight in shining armor, according to Murray, as the new owners intend on putting money into the mill to make it financially viable. He wasn't at liberty to discuss the plans for this mill, but he said we would all know in a month or two. It looks like it's avoided the chopping block once again, which is good news for a lot of families around here.

As part of the budgeting process the board members review Grants in Aid and I'm happy to report that two of the ones that we have approved include the Outdoor Recreation Users Group (ORUG) Trails Society, and the Powell River Academy of Music. Both of these organizations touch the lives of many people in our community in different ways. The Academy of Music is behind the world-recognized event, Kathaumixw, which brings hundreds of people to town every two years, and ORUG is an umbrella organization for pretty much all of the groups that promote and support use of the back country (PR PAWS, PRCA, The BOMB Squad, The Knucklehead Society, etc.). Countless volunteers work behind the scenes to make these groups successful and to provide all of us with a better way of life and they deserve our support.
