From the Area C Director....

As I'm writing this I've got my fingers crossed that the crazy winds outside don't knock the power out – it sure has been a wild end to the month! Just when I thought the yard was all ready for winter now I've got a bunch of stuff to clean up. Oh well – I can use the fresh air and exercise.

It's been a pretty eventful month, which isn't surprising now that summer is done and in the books. I finished September off by participating in the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation march from Townsite to Willingdon as well as a ceremony held by the Tla'amin First Nation on their traditional territory at Teeskwat. I was honored to take part in both of these moving events and was pleased to see how much community support there was for the Willingdon event. I was among hundreds that made the walk and took part in six minutes and fifty seconds of silence to recognize the children who have been cited as having died while attending residential schools. Hopefully these demonstrations of support continue and real steps are made towards healing and a positive future.

This month brought the final meeting of the Poverty Reduction Committee and the acceptance of the final report. Poverty is a problem that affects many people in our community and has far-reaching effects. While complete elimination of poverty is probably unachievable, there are steps that can be taken to reduce the number of families experiencing it. The report we received includes many suggestions on what our next steps could be – now it's time to determine which efforts would have the greatest impact. Two of the issues at the top of the list are affordable accommodations and child care – moves are already being made to alleviate these problems. The Social Action Planning and Advisory Committee recently received the Housing Needs Report which will hopefully provide us with the information we need to make good decisions going forward.

Also in October I joined a few of the Knuckleheads Winter Recreation Association members and installed the first of many new informational kiosks in our back country. The first one was placed at the trailhead for the E Branch Cabin (known locally as the Hillton), and will be a place where local maps, avalanche warnings and other valuable information will be displayed. Al Parsons was on hand with his machine, making digging and back-filling a whole lot easier. It's the efforts of guys like him that make it possible for so many of us to enjoy the beauty of our back-country – show them your appreciation when you see them!
