From the Area C Director....

It's been a busy few months – not particularly with qathet Regional District (qRD) activities but with life in general. This newsletter is coming out a little earlier than usual and it will be the only one you see for at least a little while because there are rules that come into effect when an election is around the corner. In case you're curious, the nominating period for Electoral Area Director lasts from August 30th to September 9th and voting occurs on October 15th (advance voting on October 5th).

Summer is traditionally a slow period in local government – major decision-making isn't usually scheduled because staff and Board members enjoy taking advantage of the weather as much as everyone else does. The qRD has put out some feelers to see if there's any interest in the community to champion an application to BC Housing for funds to develop affordable housing units in Lund – hopefully someone shows interest because qathet could certainly use some. There was also an assessment done by staff on qRD properties to determine how they could be made more accessible. While some of the proposals would be quite expensive and will need to be implemented over time, many of them are very low-cost and will be worked in more quickly. I'm very excited to see this new enthusiasm for making qRD assets more accessible to the members of our community! The qRD is also in the process of adopting new Social Media, Bylaw Complaint and Enforcement and Public Communications and Engagement policies. The first two are new and the third has been amended – all reflect the current needs of the community and our changing times. Communicating with the public especially has changed a lot in the last few years and the qRD wants to stay on top of it.

There were a few things happening with BC Ferries this summer that I imagine will be of interest to most people in our community. First off, BC Ferries CEO Mark Collins is leaving and they are currently conducting a robust search for his replacement – hopefully the change is a positive one. Many riders have experienced problems with BC Ferries recently and while there were many factors that played a part in the travel disruptions it's impossible for upper-level management to avoid shouldering at least some of the blame. Starting on July 22nd customers were again given the option to remain in their vehicles on the Route 3 (Horseshoe Bay – Langdale) ferry – that's a change that I know my family appreciates. Another positive step was the introduction of a Saver Fare on the Comox-Powell River run on the last sailings of the day in both directions until October 12th. There are a limited number of these fares and they are expected to sell out – please book online.

I hope you all are enjoying your summer and that you take the time to attend the Sunshine Music Festival at Palm Beach Park on September 3rd and 4th. Volunteers are always needed - check out www.sunshinemusicfest.ca for more info. It's a great way to end the summer!
