

- Paper bags with single or multiple paper layers (e.g. pet food bags), lunch bags
- Shredded paper -see sidenote C

DO NOT Include:

- Plastic-lined paper bags
- Envelopes with plastic windows
- 8 Hardcover or paperback books
- On-paper gift wrap (e.g. foil, ribbons or bows)
- ³ Musical greeting cards with batteries
- Padded envelopes
- Boxes with wax coatings (e.g. produce shipping boxes)
- Solution Foil lined bags (e.g. for cookies and some pet food)
- Paper towel, napkins or tissues (these are compostable)

Please Remember To:

- Empty boxes of leftover food Ø and plastic/paper liners
- Flatten all boxes Ω
- Flatten large corrugated boxes, Θ and tie in bundles no larger than 8" thick (20 cm) x 30" wide (78 cm) x **30" tall** (78 cm).

C Place shredded paper in a firmly-tied **clear** plastic bag (no opaque, coloured or black bags).

Do not leave your item in the wrong category or on the ground. Help us keep things organized! If you do not see an item included in any category then unfortunately we may not yet be able to recycle that item. Check with the regional district to see what options are in place.

The OCEAN PLASTIC DEPOT targets materials from cleanup efforts and legacy equipment from the marine sector, diverting it from landfill for reuse and recycling.



INVASIVE SPECIES

Invasive Species cause environmental, economic and social impacts in our region. These non-native species can alter habitats and disrupt essential ecosystem functions by displacing native vegetation and competing for water, nutrients, and space. Invasive plants such as knotweed can increase maintenance costs to public parks and private property and devalue real estate. Invasive plant species contribute to the loss of traditional food and medicinal plants, damage infrastructure and can reduce land and water recreational opportunities.

The qathet Regional District has an *Invasive Plant Management Strategy* and has developed an Invasive Species Disposal Plan for the region.

Resident participation in fighting the spread of invasive species is a critical part of the plan. The Regional District holds yearly invasive species drop off events. Please visit **qathet.ca** for info on the next event.

ILLEGAL DUMPING

ILLEGAL DUMPING can cause pollution, affect wildlife habitat and interfere with outdoor recreation and enjoyment. Dumping waste such as garbage, hazardous waste and even green waste is illegal. **Many items that are illegally dumped**



actually fit into FREE recycling (like the *Extended Producer Responsibility* or *EPR* programs). Items such as bulky appliances (stoves, washing machines, etc.), small and large electronics, paint, hazardous materials, propane tanks and many metal items all can be disposed of for FREE.
