Asbestos Disposal

What is asbestos?

Asbestos is a hazardous mineral fibre that was used in:

- insulation and other building materials for protection from heat, fire or sound
 - Pre 1990, asbestos was mainly used to insulate buildings
- cement or plaster to increase structural strength



When inhaled, it can cause lung-related illnesses.

The manufacture, import, sale and use of products containing asbestos is prohibited in Canada.

I'm renovating an older home. Should I be concerned?




Test for asbestos before renovating or remodeling.

Avoid moving or disturbing materials containing asbestos yourself. Hire a professional.

Safe Disposal

- × Do not place asbestos containing materials in curbside garbage.
- Hire a professional to bag and transport asbestos to a receiving facility.
- Notify staff at a receiving facility when disposing of asbestos.
