History of NVFD

1968 was the unofficial beginning of the Northside Volunteer Fire Department (NVFD). Don Ford and Skip Fair purchased the Lund Hotel's fire truck, an Austin truck and tank fitted with a pump, for the sum of \$1. With the help of others in the community, a volunteer brigade began. The newly formed brigade funded their endeavors through social events held primarily at the Lund Community Hall.

This simple beginning led to the group making a successful application for Canada Works Grants to fund construction of the original fire hall in Lund and the old Klahanie Drive and Plummer Creek Road halls.

Kent Nelson's sawmill, along with volunteer workers completed the original fire halls. The Northside area was then certified as a Fire Protection Area. The significance of this remains relevant with the current preferred fire insurance premium. Today, the NVFD continues to upgrade equipment and train volunteers.

How is NVFD funded?

Funding for the fire department is primarily through property tax contributions as budgeted by the qathet Regional District.

Another source of funding is the Northside Fire Department Association (NFDA), which collects refundable beverage containers and donates the proceeds.

Over the years, NFDA contributions have been used to purchase expensive equipment such as the Jaws of Life, a monitor (water cannon), a generator, a Thermal Imaging Camera and two AED machines.

Training

NVFD Volunteers meet weekly for training on the fire trucks and emergency equipment. Training is vital in order for volunteers to respond to emergencies and provide the required assistance.

NVFD has a division of medical first responders who are trained to provide a high level of first aid and to assistant EMS ambulance personnel.

Other fire department training includes:

- Driving enhancement
- Firefighting certification
- Confined space safety
- Use of self-contained breathing apparatus
- Air brakes endorsement
- Incident scene security and traffic control
- Motor vehicle extrications (Jaws of Life)
- Radio equipment communications
- Leadership skills

Services

NVFD service area includes the Malaspina Peninsula along Highway 101, from Klahanie Drive north to just beyond Baggi Road and Finn Bay Road. It also protects properties on the Malaspina Peninsula side of Okeover Inlet from Penrose Bay south.

The NVFD maintains two fire halls. The No. 1 Hall is located on Plummer Creek Road, commonly known as Craig Road fire hall. The No. 2 Hall was recently built in 2020 and is located on Roots Way.

NVFD emergency response services cover:

- Fires at homes, businesses, and vehicle fires
- Wildfire control
- Motor vehicle accidents
- Industrial accidents
- Medical emergencies
- Marine casualty transfers to ambulance
- Emergency water supply

NVFD is not all work!
