#### From the Area C Director....

We all knew it was going to happen yet somehow the end of the summer always comes as a bit of a shock. Things slow down at the qathet Regional District (qRD) during the warmer months to allow staff and directors to take time off but there was still plenty going on.

In July the Board approved grants for a number of organizations including \$5,000 for the Powell River Therapeutic Riding Association, \$23,000 for the Outdoor Recreational Users Group, and \$50,000 for the LIFT Community Resource Centre – all good initiatives worthy of our support. There were also two projects approved for Lasqueti Island - a Landowner Stewardship Program and the studying and recording of the Cultural History of the island. Both projects will be valuable and help guide future decision making.

One issue that got quite a bit of press recently was the decision to endorse a joint statement with the Tla'amin Nation. The joint statement was the outcome of a lot of effort made by individuals from both organizations and it succinctly conveys the feelings of the two governments. For those of you who want to read the joint statement please visit the qRD website (www.qathet.ca) and search "Joint Statement" but the basic message of the statement is that the Tla'amin Nation and the qRD require that whomever takes over ownership of the mill site have a well thought out environmental remediation plan and enough money set aside to make sure that it can be completed. There are many examples of former industrial sites that were abandoned by their owners after bankruptcy proceedings and the cleanup was left for the public to pay for. The qRD and the Tla'amin Nation wish to have a responsible owner in place that will provide jobs and economic benefit to the community for a long time.

The qRD Parks and Trails Strategy was adopted by the Board this summer. A lot of research went into the report and many members of the public participated in the discussions and filled out surveys to let the researchers know what exactly the public priorities are. The Strategy presents an overview of the existing regional and community parks and trails systems, identifies trends and challenges, and puts forward a vision, goals and actionable recommendations to guide future direction for regional and community parks services. For those of you who are interested in reading the report please visit the qRD website and search for "Parks and Trails Strategy".

One last thing that I want to mention is that I did meet with a representative from BC Parks this month to discuss the boat launch at Saltery Bay and the poor state of the trail at Inland Lake. He already knew about the trail and it was very clear to him that upgrades would be very beneficial to the boat launch but of course he couldn't commit to anything at that time. I hope that this continued advocacy eventually bears fruit. Have a great September!
