IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Resident must be property owner to apply for a rebate.
- The FireSmart volunteer compensation rate for 2024 is \$32.00/hr.
- Please note that rebates are limited to 50% of the total cost of the eligible activities and no more than \$1000 per property.
- You must apply for rebates by Dec 1st of 2024, although, if the FireSmart Rebate program continues to be funded in 2025, you can apply for a rebate one calendar year from the assessment date.
- The number of rebates available are limited and they will be issued on a first come first served basis.
- We recommend you keep a copy of the completed form and receipts. The qRD will issue a rebate cheque after 5-6 weeks of receiving a completed application form with any required receipts and/or photos.
